TEXAS, North

A cool front moved into the area during the morning and by early afternoon the front had pushed into the southern portions of the region. A warm capping layer of air aloft suppressed thunderstorm activity across the north but a weaker cap in the south enabled thunderstorms to develop in that area as the front approached. Scattered severe thunderstorms developed and moved east-southeast across the south central zones of northern Texas. Large hail, damaging wind gusts and two weak, short-lived tornadoes were produced by the stronger storms.

The cool front that became stationary across the southern zones late on the 19th, returned northward on the 20th in response to a strong upper level disturbance approaching the southern plains. Scattered to widespread thunderstorms developed and moved eastward across the southern zones of northern Texas producing large hail, damaging wind gusts, and two tornadoes. Other severe thunderstorms developed along an outflow boundary in southern Oklahoma and moved across the Red River producing severe weather in the extreme northern counties of Texas. These severe storms, a few of which were supercell thunderstorms, produced hail to baseball size, damaging wind gusts, heavy rain resulting in flash flooding and a damaging tornado.
